Glossary of Terms commonly used in Cursillo

Authentic: In accordance with the Licence gifted to the UK from Episcopal Cursillo Ministry in the USA.

BAC: British Anglican Cursillo

Clausura: The closing service of a three day weekend.

Cursillista: A person who has had the experience of a three day weekend and is using the method.

Cursillo: (pronounced 'Cur-see-yo') A movement of the church which provides a method by which Christians are empowered to grow in prayer, study and action and enabled to share God's love with everyone.

Cursillo in Cristiandad: (From the original Spanish terms) A short course (i.e. a track) in how to live a Christian life.

Cursillo method: Supporting one's Christian discipleship through the use, and participation in, Group Reunion and Ultreya.

Clergy Taster Day: An event, day, or 24 hours when clergy are invited to understand how Cursillo can help support their ministry.

CLW (Cursillo Leaders' Workshop): A weekend to increase a Cursillista's knowledge of the movement and the roles and responsibilities within the movement including the Secretariat, the Servant Community and for a weekend.

De Colores: (Spanish for 'The colours') The name of a child's song which was sung by the pilgrims walking on the Camino - the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela.

DDU (Day of Deeper Understanding): A event to remind people of the purposes and method of the Cursillo movement within the church.

Floating Group Reunion: A meeting of a small group of people who do not usually meet together, but who meet at an Ultreya or another Cursillo event.

Fourth Day: the time after a weekend when we live out our

faith in action with the support of the Cursillo method.

Gifting: The process by which an existing Cursillo Diocese enables another Diocese to establish the Cursillo, with the permission of the gifting and receiving Dioceses.

Gifting Liaison Officer: (GLO) The person appointed to oversee the gifting process.

Group Reunion: A short meeting of a small (3-5) group of friends or colleagues who regularly share their prayer, study and actions. It is primarily a listening group.

Lay Director: The person who leads Cursillo in a Diocese.

Lay Rector: The person appointed to lead a three day weekend.

Meditation: A reflective talk given by clergy on a three day weekend concerning a passage of scripture.

Palanca: (Spanish for a lever) Prayer and selfless acts of love, which may include visible signs e.g. cards for a weekend participant or person in need.

Participant: One who takes part in a three day weekend.

Piety: Interchangeable with **'prayer'** in Cursillo literature: time taken in a closer walk with God.

Rollo: A talk at the three day weekend "pronounced Roy-O"

Rule of Life: An individual and personal plan for Christian commitment and living which is reviewed regularly.

Secretariat: The officers elected to form a committee responsible for managing and organising Cursillo in a Dioceses.

Servant Community: Those who are active in the Cursillo community, supporting the use of the Cursillo method.

Spiritual Adviser: A member of the clergy who are on team for a three day weekend or on duty at an Ultreya.

Spiritual Director: The priest who works together with the Lay Director of a Diocesan Cursillo and is responsible for all

spiritual matters as well as arranging for clergy to attend Ultreyas and to be on team on a Cursillo weekend and is appointed by the bishop.

Sponsor: The person who is responsible for seeking out, preparing and supporting potential candidates for a weekend.

Team/Staff: Cursillistas who are prepared and trained to serve on a three day weekend.

Three Day Weekend (Sometimes referred to as the Authentic Three Day Weekend): A weekend which goes from sunset to sunset, usually from a Thursday evening to a Sunday afternoon, and during which time a selected team of trained Cursillistas (clergy and lay) deliver 15 talks and 5 meditations to committed Christians who have not previously been on a weekend and who have been sponsored by existing Cursillistas.

Ultreya: 1) A word of encouragement to persevere and keep going.

Ultreya: 2) A meeting of reunion groups and other Christians to share together in prayer, study and action and to listen to one person's recent experience of action, a response by a member of the clergy, and how this is relevant to our own growth in faith.

Wake Up: A term used in some Dioceses for a short early morning gathering.
